PREMIER GOLD MINES OPENS COMMUNITY RELATIONS OFFICE

Geraldton, June 20, 2013 - Premier Gold Mines was happy to welcome 500 people to its new Community Relations Office in Geraldton with nearly 1,000 hamburgers, smokies and hot dogs being served. The opening reflects Premier Gold's intent to develop its Hardrock Project in a transparent way by maintaining active communications with local communities. The office will serve as a key location for community stakeholders and local residents to meet with the Community Relations team, receive updates and discuss issues of interest

on the Hardrock project and other projects being developed by Premier Gold. "We want to develop a responsible project and by doing so, have a positive impact on local communities. We are committed to considering communities' interests and concerns throughout the development of the Hardrock Project and our Community Relations Office will be the cornerstone of that promise", stated Ewan S. Downie, CEO and President of Premier Gold Mines. The event was a great opportunity for residents, business owners, stakeholders and members of First Nation communities and Métis groups to meet and discuss with Dina Quenneville, Community and Social Affairs Manager, and Cheryl Lesperance, Manager - Aboriginal, Community and Social Affairs, as well as members of the Company's development and senior management team. "We encourage anyone who has questions or concerns about the project to contact or to come visit us at the office. We will be there 5 days a week", said Ms. Quenneville. Premier Gold has started economic, engineering, environment and impact studies for the potential development of the Hardrock gold deposit. The Preliminary Economic Assessment (PEA) is expected to be completed by the end of the year and will provide Premier Gold with the necessary information to make a decision on three development scenarios being considered. These scenarios could include both open pit and underground operations.
